EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTIONS

What this fact sheet covers

This fact sheet provides information about what you can do if you believe that your employer is not paying super contributions on your behalf.

Am I eligible to receive superannuation contributions?

The Superannuation Guarantee (SG) is a compulsory system of superannuation support.

In most circumstances, your employer must contribute the equivalent of 9.5% of your salary to your nominated superannuation fund. There are some exceptions to this.

The Australian Taxation Office (ATO) has a handy online tool to help you work out if you are eligible for SG contributions. To access the tool, visit www.ato.gov.au and search 'unpaid super'.

How can I check how much I am receiving?

The best place to start is the member statement sent to you by your super provider. You can also contact your super provider directly.

Who can assist?

The ATO may be able to help ensure that your employer is paying contributions on your behalf. Visit www.ato.gov.au and search for 'unpaid super', or call 13 10 20 for more information.
